- 1. How many painted koalas can you find on Port Macquarie's biggest Hello Koalas sculpture? You'll find her at Guulabaa, an Aboriginal name meaning 'Place of Koala'
- 2. You'll go wild with the fun of bouncing balls and meeting the Hello Koalas sculpture which wants to save species in our rainforests
- 3. This striking Aboriginal design overlooks the 'Donut' and captures the blue waters and froth of the ocean waves
- 4. There is only one tiger in Port Macquarie where is it?
- 5. A warrior that alerts people to care for our Australian wildlife through a rainbow of bright colours. Can you find the green snake?
- 6. Wearing a bright red helmet, this koala is a trusted friend and has the best "Place" to call home!
- 7. A design of gumnuts, blossoms and leaves against a bright red backdrop
- 8. Sitting quietly at a local university, this koala is learning to be a doctor.
- 9. Max is a gentle giant who reminds us that animals can become extinct if they are not cared for and he has a brand new home to visit and say 'hello'
- 10. A beautiful lady who loves singing and wears a costume of Australian wildflowers
- 11. Painted by an important artist from the Bunyah Aboriginal community, this koala says hello to lots of shoppers everyday
- 12. A koala who enjoys the beach and reminds people to swim safely between the flags
- 13. Historic sailing ships are featured in this classic blue and white willow design
- 14. You'll find two koalas here with names from Greek mythology. Which one is the Greek God of the Sea?
- 15. Living by the marina, this koala has a design inspired by Port Macquarie's Shelly beach. Take a break and enjoy fish and chips too!
- 16. Making a special appearance at the Tortuga Festival at Westport Park near the boxoffice
- 17. One of the oldest koalas in history who lived in town and died at 22 years of age and now she is still under the spotlight in a 'Wise' CBD location
- 18. You'll find this Hello Koalas sculpture at home behind a large glass window at its favourite bank. Pop in and say hello
- 19. A treasure painted in gold and inspired by Chinese culture, hosted by an Asian inspired restaurant in a riverside location
- 20. A dancing koala who is the subject of a children's book called 'Lola had a Dream'

- 21. A koala who is so famous he had a courtyard named after him at Port Macquarie Museum
- 22. A well known barman around town who is a member of the zebu family of animals
- Times were difficult in the early days of settlement in Port Macquarie especially for convicts
- 24. A shimmering blue koala which glows with vitality, featuring The Tree of Life in her design
- 25. Is that a bird or a plane? No it's the Cub Reporter for Port News
- 26. "We're here to take you there" is the tagline of one of our brand new koalas who loves volunteering in the community and taking people for a drive to appointments
- 27. The ABC's koala is named after the last Tasmanian Tiger which died in 1936 and the species became extinct
- 28. An underwater fairyland with creatures large and small, and welcoming ocean breezes and a lovely place to stay
- 29. Take a bike ride to Lake Cathie and visit this famous cyclist and have a great coffee
- 30. It's black and white and has a tag in its ear with the Comboyne postcode 2429
- 31. There's a zebra in amongst the summer's flowing plants in our nursery is that really a koala?
- 32. This koala loves hearing from people who admire her flannel flowers and butterflies
- 33. When driving where koalas live, it's important to drive safely according to this Hello Koalas sculpture who now lives in Timbertown
- 34. We love their pies and sweet treats and now they have one of the most gorgeous Hello Koalas in town. Stop by for something delicious
- 35. The Aboriginal word 'Guula' means 'koala' and she is fascinated by trains
- 36. Take the turnoff for a drive up the highway to meet a special koala who celebrates the country music of one of Australia's finest. There's a Museum too that tells his great life story with his wife Joy, plus a gift shop with mementoes and a café
- 37. Back home to pick up a game of Port Macquarie Monopoly and see the Hello Koalas sculpture that's featured on the board, wearing a love heart for his home town
- 38. A mascot for a mighty rugby football team in Port Macquarie
- 39. Showing off her new swimming costume is one of Hello Koalas' glamorous ladies
- 40. A koala as sweet as honey with a bee on its nose

Hello Koalas Sculpture Gallery and Gift Shop is located in Bellbowrie Park Business Centre, at Unit 16, 10 Bellbowrie Street, Port Macquarie. It's just 5 minutes away from Settlement City Shopping Centre. Turn into the roadway to the Shop off Bellbowrie Street alongside PC Pitstop. Opening hours 9am to 4pm Monday to Saturday during the Treasure Hunt.
